Kaitake Ranges Conservation Trust AGM

The Kaitake Ranges Conservation Trust will be holding their AGM at Butlers Reef back bar, Tuesday 27th February at 6.30, followed by a presentation from the Taranaki Kiwi Trust at 7.30.

Twelve months ago I reported on the 10 years of activity that the Okato Development Trust had put in to keep the Sefton Ridge track operative for public use. The last twelve months have been very successful for us as we have achieved several goals that were planned.

First, we have a new signed agreement with the Department of Conservation under our new name of "Kaitake Ranges Conservation Trust".

Second, we have successfully applied to the TSB Community Trust to upgrade some gear and buy another 30 traps, 10 of which are gas operated self setting kill traps. Keen interest will be taken on how successful we feel these traps are.

With the 30 traps we have started 3 new trapping lines which different committee members are monitoring. We now monitor 68 stoat traps. Most importantly we have continued to maintain the Sefton Ridge Track to a high standard but also clip and snip the Waimoku track on our way round. It is very satisfying to know that the public are taking advantage of our efforts with the track getting a lot of use.

The next stage: Our plans are to hold a public meeting after our AGM at Butlers Reef Hotel back bar. This will help us gauge the interest of local people in what we are doing. We are keen to increase our numbers to enable us to increase the number of trap lines. They are a commitment, we target weekly monitoring or at least every 2 weeks so it will keep any volunteers fit!

Self setting traps cost us \$149.50 and the Haines stoat traps cost us \$85.00 should you wish to sponsor one!

We would love to have Kiwi return to the Kaitakes. While we are making an effort with the small pests, addressing possums, cats and dogs is an issue with much debate.

If you are interested in how we run, you are invited to our AGM starting at **6.30pm Tuesday 27th February.**

At 7.30 Michelle Bird from the Taranaki Kiwi Trust will give us an update on Kiwi and effective trapping in the National Park and information on what's required before Kiwi could be reestablished in the Kaitakes again.

If you would like to hear what Michelle has to say or want to be involved, but not into AGM's, just come along at **7.30 Tuesday 27th February.**

Kaitake Farm still growing!

It has been a year since I visited Kaitake Farm on the slopes of the Kaitake Ranges and over the year the farm has literally grown its vegetable growing business!

One year on Ryan Gut and Toby Dixon have well and truly established themselves as the finest purveyors of fresh vegetables. Most of the farms customers buy their produce from Beach Rd Milk Co and the farm supplies nearly a dozen commercial customers including Oakura Four Square and Down to Earth - a far cry from the angst the pair were experiencing a year ago about whether locals would buy their vegetables. The vegetables are so popular at Beach Rd Milk Co you have to be in quick otherwise they sell out! Toby says the micro greens and salad greens have been especially popular with demand far outstripping supply. As a purchaser of these I know how fresh and delicious they are - they keep for ages in the fridge. Other customers I've spoken to are very appreciative for the supply of fresh, organic vegetables and some go as far to say they even feel better health wise for eating such fresh, healthy produce.

Many changes have occurred on site at Kaitake Farm. The humble beginnings of a single outside tub under the hedge for washing vegetables has evolved into a shed with two baths, a whole range of drying equipment plus weighing, packing, labelling and chilling paraphernalia has been added. Outdoors the pigs have gone and their paddock ploughed up to add more growing space, a tunnel house has been built along with a green house and equipment shed. Toby and Ryan have also taken on a part time helper - Seth Marshall. Toby's mum and dad Murray and Gay also help out with technical expertise and gardening. Long hours are spent sowing crops, weeding, composting, harvesting and packaging - it's a labour of love and everyone involved is loving their work.

Toby and Ryan are still as passionate about their farm and partnership as they were a year ago. The challenges of working in the outdoors against weather and pests has brought about some creative thinking to problem solve in an organic and sustainable environment - solar power, entomological warfare, natural fertilisers, composting and crop rotation to name a few. The pair are still eager to find an environmentally friendly alternative to the single use plastic bag in which the greens are sold and currently recycle the brown paper bags other vegetables are sold in - drop them into Beach Rd if you want to help with recycling.

The farm has recently been awarded a grant for a business project using an electric vehicle so shortly you will see vegetables being delivered to Beach Rd Milk Co via electricity (probably produced via the solar panels too)!

Well done to Toby and Ryan on a year's hard work - the results are phenomenal! by Kim Ferens

Have you heard about La Petite Cabane?

It's the new food place to try in the village! La Petite Cabane has been open about a month and is serving crepes from a delightfully homemade creperie on the beachfront within the Oakura Holiday Beach Camp.

La Petite Cabane is located right beside the camp playground, 50 metres along from the camp gate and is open Wednesday to Sunday from 11am to 5pm.

La Petite Cabane is operated by Valerie Donsimoni, a French Corsican who along with her family have made Oakura home.

Valerie and husband Pascal (who works at High Tide Cafe as a pastry chef) first arrived in New Zealand seven years ago and Oakura three years ago. They fell in love with Oakura and have returned here with their son Noé who attends Sophia Preschool.

La Petite Cabane has a menu with a French touch but Valerie has adapted it to the Kiwi tastebuds. The crepes are healthy - organic produce, with gluten free and dairy free buckwheat crêpes for the savoury options and authentic taste from Brittany for the sweet. Valerie says the most popular crepe is the bacon, avocado and tomato option. The most traditional French option is the egg, ham and cheese and the butter, sugar and lemon but all of the options are proving popular.

La Petite Cabane is open all over the summer season and Valerie welcomes campers and locals to drop in for a little taste of France on Oakura's beachfront.

March. Tiger Turf has been in and groomed the courts over the holidays ready for competition which commenced on the 27th January.



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
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
