another couple who are new to the Festival and were like Maria Vander-Poel who have had their garden in the local Garden Safari held bi-annually in the Okato district.

Chris can only assume from this that Suzanne Porter and Lisa Haskell, from TAFT (Taranaki Arts Festival Trust) must have submitted her garden for this event.

"When the report came back for the garden, I thought they must have mistaken my garden for someone else's, I didn't really have the conviction that our garden would be up to speed" said Chris.

Chris has an absolute passion for gardening, along with many other activities in their busy lives and has been establishing their garden from the time they first built their house 25 years ago. The children were always involved in the gardening and hold special memories of planting and watching them grow.

plants have found homes nestled amongst rocks and boulders, roses and rhododendrons add colour and the spacious gardens are also a great space for entertaining.

Every corner is a reminder of family and friends, as plants have been given as gifts. The largest tree in the garden is an acorn which was given to them from a prominent stud master. These plants will always have special memories connected with them.

Fire Brigade News


All is pretty quiet on the call-out side of things. That is not a bad thing though!

Rachel Marston has designs on women's fashion

Twenty-three year old Rachel Marston, daughter of Jackie and Kevin Honeyfield, is in her final year of a three year course at WITT, from which she will graduate with a Diploma in Fashion. I talked to her recently about her work and her aspirations.

Rachel has always been interested in fashion and took the subject by correspondence at school, so pursuing the course was a natural progression towards a career in fashion design. Her polytech

programme covers everything from designing to sewing techniques, computer skills to business skills. It prepares students to design and make day wear, evening wear and performance wear, which includes wet weather gear.

As part of her professional practice this year, Rachel was required to develop a design concept that expressed and publicised an issue and helped, in some way, to resolve it. Her work and that of her classmates was then showcased in an exhibition called Realpolitik. Rachel, an environmentalist, has long been frustrated by having to accept plastic bags for her groceries and although recyclable bags are available in most supermarkets these days, "they're really unattractive," she grimaces. So, she set about providing fashion-conscious shoppers with a range of environmentally sound alternatives. Her

specifications were simple: "My bags had to be made from recycled fabrics, be functional and look good".

A company called Morris and Co, who used to supply fabrics for the furnishing trade, was closing down and gave WITT all of its old fabrics, including sample books. "I was lucky to get my hands on them—all that vintage stuff is coming back," said Rachel, who used them to create her retro-styled bags. But recycling didn't stop there. All of the buckles, buttons, zips and other add-ons were from op shops and even the thread had been left-over from other projects. "I didn't buy anything new," Rachel told me, proudly. Her finished bags, which took two or three hours each to create, are beautifully crafted and no two are alike. Her favourite, which she had wanted to keep, was quickly snaffled up, along with several others. She's not too worried though - there are plenty more designs where those came from.

During the next semester, she was asked to design a collection for a favourite designer's range. The collection had to be themed and it had to flow. To illustrate this, she produced a computergenerated "story board" and a sketch book to support it. Rachel's favourite designer is Cybele, whose high fashion designs are "very feminine, with amazing prints and fabrics." Her ranges reflect Rachel's love of "casual clothes, but feminine, with a bit of frill." Rachel also tried her hand at collections for Deborah Sweeny (a lot more day wear – loose fitting and casual) and Juliette Hogan (relaxed yet sweet, and feminine high fashion garments). Her final challenge, for a Farmers' range, saw her designing a collection for Rage Semme, who creates clothes for mature women. That was perhaps the biggest challenge of all.

During this, her final semester, Rachel and her classmates are designing mini collections that will be shown at their graduate exhibition, "Fabricate," to be held on Friday 13 November at WITT. They are looking for sponsorship for this event, to help with printing costs and to provide food and wine for their guests. Watch for final details and contact Rachel if you feel you can help!

With her diploma in sight, Rachel is planning for her future and she's excited by the challenges and opportunities it promises. She hopes to have her own label one day, and to concentrate on designing women's wear. Together with husband, Blake, she plans to settle in New Plymouth and believes that staying local

will be advantageous. It will allow her to start out small, perhaps by launching a range of "after five" dresses, and to raise her profile within a smaller community at first. We wish her every success!




